Young Women's and Men's Program

The 2014 Young Women's & Men's Program is achieving some outstanding outcomes. We recently completed a new video presentation that captures the year's activities to date. We invite you to view the video link that is posted above.

In the last school term we have been focusing on: building self confidence and self worth; connecting young people with their communities and teaching practical life skills. Some examples of the sessions have included things like:

Practical Life Skills

• Constructing a billy-cart

Teaching the benefits of exercise, rest and taking care of our bodies

· Doing yoga and dance sessions, teaching about health and hygiene

Diversity appreciation workshops

 Preparing and eating healthy foods from other cultures, presenting our unique talents and skills

Positive self-image workshops

 Talking about the things that hold us back, and the things that make us beautiful





We have received positive feedback on the behaviour and personal growth of the young men and women that participate from schools and parents. Our Youth Workers or Edventures "Life Changers" have noted a significant improvement in participants maturity, self confidence and mindfulness. This is a terrific result and we are achieving the outcomes we continue to strive for. Our Life Changer team is looking forward to watching our young people develop further over the remainder of the year.

The young people that participate in Edventures' programs are provided with opportunities for developing life skills and competencies in a supportive environment. This is achieved through the delivery of weekly after school program's that are long-term, safe, consistent, predictable and flexible to the needs of our young people.

Edventures' programs are facilitated by experienced and caring, non-judgemental youth workers who receive regular supervision and support.
